

What is this role / apprenticeship?

Early Years Educators, and other job roles such as nursery nurse and childminders, are highly trained professionals who play a key role in ensuring that young children learn and develop well and are kept healthy and safe. They work in a range of settings including full day care, children's centres, pre schools, reception classes and as childminders. They may either be working on their own or supervising others to deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) requirements set by Government for the learning, development and care of children from birth to 5 years old.

How long does the apprenticeship take?

The apprenticeship will take between 18-24 months to complete.

What qualifications will the learner receive?

- Level 2 Certificate in Functional Skills English
- Level 2 Certificate in Functional Skills Mathematics
- Institute for Apprenticeships Early Years Educator Level 3, achievable at Pass or Distinction.

• Level 3 Award in Paediatric First Aid. (RQF) or Level 3 Award in Emergency Paediatric First Aid (RQF) Or complete a first aid course delivered by one of the following types of organisations as per the EYFS requirements

What are the entry requirements?

To undertake the Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) process and provide the result prior to starting.
